One Hundred and Fifty Four Civil Society Organizations and Individuals Worried about Reverend David Ugolor.

One hundred and fifty-four (154) civil society organizations and individuals drawn from the six geo-political zones of the country have expressed their concerns over the continued detention of Reverend David Ugolor who was arrested on the 27th of July 2012 in Benin City in connection with the murder of Comrade Oyerinde, a Principal Secretary to the Edo State Governor.

Latest reports from Benin City had it that as at 3.47pm Nigerian time on Sunday 12th August, Ugolor was transported in a chartered bus belonging to Uyo Motors from the Force Headquarter in Benin City and headed for Abuja and is now being held at the Garki Police Divisional Headquarter, Abuja.

The Organizations and individuals are concerned that eighteen (18) days after his arrest Ugolor is yet to be charged to court according to constitutional provisions, a development which is certainly against his fundamental human rights. We caution, therefore, against the continued detention of Ugolor and ask that the Nigerian Police and all concerned authorities take the appropriate actions by either charging Ugolor to court now or release him without further unnecessary delays.

As civil society organizations and individuals we are interested in finding the true killers of Comrade Oyerinde and call on the State's security apparatus to expedite action in finding the very true killers of Oyerinde.

Oyebisi Babatunde Oluseyi, Executive Director, Nigeria Network of NGOs (NNNGO) notes: "The Nigerian Police must ensure that their investigations into the murder case of Comrade Oyerinde is detailed and professional without any form of witch-hunt and side taking".

The organizations and individuals call on governments at all levels in Nigeria to protect the space for those advancing progressive, liberal ideas by strengthening the civil society space. The State and dominant political groups should work with civil society organizations in ensuring that the state of insecurity in Nigeria is properly addressed while cautioning against labeling activists and civil society leaders wrongly.
